Did China build a research station in Antarctica before Qinling?

Construction work, which started in December, was conducted by members of the nation's 40th Antarctic expedition, which set off from Shanghai in early November and arrived in Antarctica later that month. Before Qinling, China had constructed four research stations in Antarctica -- Changcheng, Zhongshan, Taishan and Kunlun.

Where is Qinling station?

Qinling Station (Chinese: 秦岭站; pinyin: Qínlíng zhàn) is an Antarctic research station operated by the Polar Research Institute of China. It is situated on the southern edge of Inexpressible Island in Terra Nova Bay, Scott Coast, Victoria Land, on the Ross Sea coast of East Antarctica.

Zhongshan Station is located in the ice-free Larsemann Hills, in the Prydz Bay region of East Antarctica (at 69°22'44"S 76°22'40"E), just a few kilometres from the Russian station, Progress II. Discovered by Norwegian Whalers in 1934-35, the Larsemann Hills consist of a narrow band of parallel peninsulas stuck between the ice sheet and the ocean.
